Did you ever wonder where all the things that are shipped from MCC end up? Well, recently we found someone who said she remembers items that came from America when she was a child growing up in the Ukraine. She said her father had a room in their house where he stored goods sent from America. He was in charge of distributing these items to people in need in the community. It was a long time ago that Katharina Efimenko, who now resides at Rockhill Mennonite Community, became the recipient of something from MCC. Katherine, as she prefers to be called, is now 90 years old, but she can still remember with appreciation the yellow hat she received as a young girl.

Katherine is a truly remarkable lady, who volunteered many years at the Care and Share Thrift Shoppe in Souderton. Her life has been filled with hardship. Her mother died when she was 10 years old. Two of her brothers were sent to Siberia for many years during the war. When the war ended she married Iwan and they made their way, first to Brazil, and then to the United States. The couple had two daughters. Tragically, they lost both daughters, one in a car accident in 1982 and the other after complications from a liver transplant in 1999. Her husband also died in 1989.

To face as many hardship as Katherine Efimenko had to endure during her lifetime, is incomprehensible to most people. Katherine, however, always kept going, never giving up, and always working hard. She still continues to smile through her tears, and gives of herself everyday.



Katherine recently took a tour of our MRC facility. She wanted to see how it is done, the process of making, packing, sorting, baling and shipping the items that end up in the hands of those who are so grateful for them.
