Her most recent assignment with MCC, just prior to coming to MRC, was to head up the quilt auction at the Pennsylvania Relief Sale in Harrisburg this spring.

Other items on her resume include substitute teaching in grades K through high school, teaching conflict resolution skills and facilitating group activities with middle school girls in McConnellsburg, PA and Frederick, MD. Sharon is a graduate of Morehead State University, Morehead, KY. Sharon and her husband have three sons and live in Sellersville, PA.

"Why Knot!" Week at West Swamp Mennonite

Every year for the last five years, Mennonite Central Committee has been the recipient of many beautiful comforters made during a week-long event held at West Swamp Mennonite Church. This is the way it all began.

Sometime in the 1980's, women from West Swamp Mennonite began meeting regularly to prepare and knot comforters. Unfinished comforters accumulated -at one point to a height of 30 feet!

It was then that they decided to have a marathon type of event whereby the work of making comforters would happen all week from 9 in the morning until 9 at night! That year, in 2006, one hundred and forty-five comforters were finished in one week.

West Swamp's quilter's records go back to 1949 when records identified that a quilt was made. Although it

did not state whether that quilt was sent to MCC, it was the beginning of a good thing. Later records indicate that 25 quilts were donated to MCC in 1973. That same year, 22 quilts were made during a Women in Missions Work Day.

This year's "Why Knot" event was held from March 22-29. Many women, men and teens contribute to this project by sorting fabrics, ironing, cutting patches, sewing them together, sewing backs, knotting the comforters, finishing the edges and delivering the product to MCC Ephrata or Harleysville Material Resource Centers.

Good job, West Swamp!! Many persons around the world will be warmed and blessed.

Chinese Students Learn About Volunteering

Martha Stern was once a missionary nurse, having served in Africa for 34 years. These days she is a missionary of another kind – living and working at Philadelphia House, a residence for International Students, who attend St. Joe's University. MRC Happenings

- Annual Oyster Lover's Express trip over 135 people traveled by motorcoach to Tilghman Island, Maryland, to enjoy eastern shore oysters prepared a dozen different ways at the Harrison's Chesapeake House. If oysters are not your "thing" you can join the group anyway, there are alot of other choices on the buffet!
- Oyster Dinner 2010 Mark October 23, 2010 at 6:30 pm down in your calendar for our annual Oyster Dinner to be held at Christopher Dock High School. The Oyster Dinner Committee is excited at the potential to host 300 this year.
- Three quilts were donated to the PA Relief Sale.
- In April, 2 tons of cardboard was baled for recycling.

- In April, 600 health kits, 168 relief kits, 108 comforters were sent to MCC.
- Over the last 12 months, 20 churches have contributed 1,041 grocery bags for distribution by Philadelphia Churches.
- A truckload of clothing, shoes and purses was sold and are being sent overseas.

- Finished kit bags can be picked up at the MRC to be filled with school kit or health kit items.
