MCC Canner Operates at MRC'S New Facility

When the "MCC Canner-man", Abe Landes, heard that the MCC Canner truck was headed to our new facility, he kicked this year's canning operation into high gear. It was Monday, March 28th. Everything was ready: volunteers, cans, chunks of meat, boxes, food for the volunteers -- it was all ready to go!

Even though a few glitches delayed the operation's start time until after noon of that day, the volunteers worked feverishly and were able to produce 6,214 cans of meat throughout the remainder of Monday and all day Tuesday. Next year in 2012, we plan to operate for the entire three days.

A single can of meat will feed 10 persons at approximately 23 cents per meal. From MRC, the boxes of canned meat were shipped to the warehouse in Ephrata, PA. From that location, it will be sent to needy areas around the world. Some recipients get paid with meat for their labor, others receive meat in times of war, natural disaster or poverty. Total costs are covered by donations and volunteers contributing their labor.
