Grocery Bag Collection

At the MRC we are again collecting grocery bags to share with Philadelphia Churches and Ministries. Our goal is to have 100 food bags each month for distribution in Philadelphia. Individuals and churches are invited to help with this ministry to those in need of food.

MRC Happenings

Groups are welcome to tour the MRC and also give their time in volunteer activities. Recent groups included Vacation Bible School classes, women's groups and young adult groups.

Machine Quilting is a new project at the MRC. This technique will not replace hand-quilting, but serves as an alternative method for quilting simple designs and practical items.

During the months of June and July 1,800 health kits, 336 relief kits, 164 newborn kits, 655 comforters and 440 school kits were collected and sent to MCC.

Plastics recycling work has started and will generate income for the MRC.

MCC East Coast Meat Canning

Each year since 1946, MCC has sent out a Mobile meat canner, which MCC workers and volunteers use to preserve tons of cans of meat for communities in need across the globe. In 2009, 563,648 cans were shipped to 30 different countries. This year a four-person crew will visit 13 US states and 2 Canadian provinces from October through April.

In previous years, when the Canner came to our area, the process happened on the Christopher Dock campus. This year, we are so excited about having the Canner at

MRC's new location at 737 Hagey Center Drive in Franconia Township from March 28 to March 30, 2011. Many volunteers will be needed for four hour shifts. Some of the tasks to be done are: stirring the meat, packing the meat in cans, washing and labeling the cans, and general help.
