

If your Sunday School Class, Youth Group or other group would like to volunteer for an evening please call 267-203-8074. Groups are being scheduled for the 3rd Tuesday evening of the month, between 6:30 and 8:30 pm.

Each month volunteers take 100 grocery bags filled with basic foods to Philadelphia to be shared with people in need of food. Empty bags can be picked up from the MRC, filled with the items listed on the side and returned or filled bags can be purchased at Landis Markets. Donations of money are also accepted for this project.


